Or, at least, something about it is recognizable, the timing is bad. Because among the dumb, insufficient platitudes I might offer to Akila or myself is the truth. And the truth is that when the officer had his arm pressed into my neck, there was a part of me that felt like, all right. Like, fine. Because there will always be a part of me that is ready to die. (Leilani, 2020, p. 160)

## **D.** Conclusion

The conclusion of this thesis is from the data analysis, there are several points that can be concluded. Regarding to the novel, which discusses the depiction of identity crisis through the main character in the novel *Luster*. It also represents the causes the protagonist developed identity crisis.
